<u>LWV of Marblehead Takes Action</u>

Also happening on the North Shore **TOMORROW**, Saturday April 19, 2025 at 1 PM, LWV of Marblehead invites the public to their <u>"No More Kings - Rally for Democracy"</u>.

"Our democracy is under threat and we will peacefully assemble to stand against the rise of authoritarianism in our country, while celebrating the success of the American colonists in pushing back the vengeful tyrant king in 1775.

The program starts at 1 p.m. at the Marblehead Old Town House (Washington Street, Marblehead) where the Longfellow poem "Paul Revere's Ride" will be read from the steps. The group will then walk to Abbot Hall (188 Washington Street, Marblehead) and assemble near the flagpole to hear a reading of the Declaration of Independence.

The program should last about one hour. Families are welcome. Attendees are encouraged to bring signs to this peaceful "No More Kings" assembly." (<u>LWV of</u> <u>Marblehead</u>)


V URGENT: The SAVE Act is Still on the Table!



Celina Stewart, LWVUS CEO, issued a statement in response to the passage of the <u>SAVE (Safeguard American Voter Eligibility)</u> <u>Act</u> in the US House. Her remarks were chilling: "Today is a dark day in politics...and a dangerous step backward for our democracy." <u>Read the full press release</u> on the LWVUS site and consider taking one or more of the actions below and share them with friends!

<u>LWVUS Declares Constitutional Emergency</u>



"After careful monitoring and analysis, LWVUS has decided that now is the time to sound the alarm: **our country is in a full-on constitutional crisis.** The foundational principles that have sustained our democracy — checks and balances, the rule of law, free and

fair elections — are under direct and sustained attack."

On Thursday, April 17 (the eve of the 250th anniversary of <u>Paul Revere's Ride to</u> <u>Revolution</u>), the League of Women Voters of the United States declared a constitutional crisis along with its intention to launch an 8.5 million-strong initiative, called Unite & Rise 8.5.
