## "What does it mean right now to live like acitizen?

Acitizen —amember of the body, acontributor to community. Not asubject. Not aspectator.

Someone responsible for self-government.

[We must] **localize** when the pressure is to nationalize; to **humanize** when the incentives are to dehumanize; to **practice mutual aid and service** when the temptation is to turn inward." (Emphasis ours)

## **✓**URGENT: The SAVE Act is Still on the Table!

With <u>Congress in recess</u> until May 3rd, we still have time to take action! Spread the word to friends in swing states. Maybe they can petition their senators back in their home offices.



Celina Stewart, LWVUS CEO, issued a statement in response to the passage of the SAVE (Safeguard American Voter Eligibility) Act in the US House. Her remarks were chilling: "Today is adark day in politics...and adangerous step backward for our democracy." Read the full press release on the LWVUS site and consider taking one or more of the actions below and share them with friends!

- Tell your Senators to oppose the SAVE Act: the Senate must reject this bill to prevent it from becoming law. Call the US Capitol switchboard at 202-224-3121 (pro tip: save this in your contacts!) or take email action.
- Take amoment to **respond** to your member of the House's vote on the SAVE Act either by **calling** the switchboard (aren't you glad you saved it in your contacts?) or take email action.
- •Get familiar with these great Talking Points compiled by LWVUS to help push back on misinformation.
- •Share information with young voters: LWVUS CEO, Celina Stewart, wrote an excellent and informative op-ed for Teen Vogue about the harm the SAVE Act will cause nationwide: What is the SAVE Act? The Trump Admin's Attempt to Strip Voting Rights from Women and Young People.

For those of us on social media, it can be frustrating to see misleading, untrue, or negative comments about actions. Here are some useful tips to follow if commenters are reacting negatively to something *positive* or *neutral* (example: apost about arally).

- 1. **Don't engage directly** —do not argue, comment, share, or emoji the negative comments.
- 2. **Find apositive comment** and then "like" it and add areply with **another** positive comment.
- 3. Add your own positive comment to the post.

Engaging directly with the negative comment or post, gives it more oxygen and makes it more likely to be seen. Ignoring the negative and instead following these steps, pushes positive comments up the chain and gives them more credence. Stay smart out there!


## THANK YOU!
