For 105 years, Leaguers have gathered around the Commonwealth to organize and mobilize voters at the polls and the State House. From the 19th Amendment




to the VOTES Act of 2022, the League of Women Voters has been at the forefront of empowering voters and defending democracy.

LWVUS Responds to Arrest of Milwaukee County Circuit Judge



On April 25, 2025, federal agents arrested
Milwaukee County Circuit Judge Hannah Dugan
at her courthouse for allegedly obstructing the
unlawful arrest of Eduardo Flores-Ruiz. In
response, the League of Women Voters CEO
Celina Stewart released the following statement:
"Make no mistake: the targeting of Judge Dugan
is terrifying, unacceptable, and dangerous.
Federal agents arresting a sitting state court
judge undermines the sanctity of the judiciary and
threatens us all.

"Amid an alarming intensification of the targeting of noncitizens by this administration, this act is a clear attempt to silence and intimidate anyone who stands up for the rights of noncitizens. Today's action creates a chilling ripple effect that erodes faith in institutions meant to protect and serve us all.

"In this incredibly divisive and dangerous moment, it is up to all of us — no matter our political leaning — to fight for our neighbors, our communities, and the vision of the country we want to live in."

URGENT: The SAVE Act is Still on the Table!

With <u>Congress in recess</u> until May 3rd, we still have time to take action! Spread the word to friends in swing states. Maybe they can petition their senators back in their home offices.



Celina Stewart, LWVUS CEO, issued a statement in response to the passage of the SAVE (Safeguard American Voter Eligibility) Act in the US House. Her remarks were chilling: "Today is a dark day in politics...and a dangerous step backward for our democracy." Read the full press release on the LWVUS site and consider taking one or more of the actions below and share them with friends!

- <u>Tell your Senators to oppose the SAVE Act</u>: the Senate must reject this bill to
 prevent it from becoming law. <u>Call</u> the US Capitol switchboard at 202-224-3121
 (pro tip: save this in your contacts!) or take email action.
- Take a moment to <u>respond to your member of the House's vote</u> on the SAVE Act either by <u>calling</u> the switchboard (aren't you glad you saved it in your contacts?) or <u>take email action</u>.
- Get familiar with these great <u>Talking Points compiled by LWVUS</u> to help push back on misinformation.
- Share information with young voters: LWVUS CEO, Celina Stewart, wrote an


