# FROM THE PRESIDENT

It was the Board's decision that, in the interest of the health and well-being of the League members and guests attending the Forum, Zoom would be the better format. We will be evaluating all potential in-person events according to the prevailing information as we move forward.

These are not easy decisions to make. Be aware that it is the safety and wellbeing of our members that is utmost in our minds. We would all like to be together and we believe we can help make that happen in the near future, hopefully by Christmas. Meanwhile, we will all continue to try to do our part to craft a safer future. #### **Important Voting Dates for 2021**

**September 17**th — First day to apply for a mail-in or civilian absentee ballot for the 2021 Municipal Election

October 18<sup>th</sup> — Last day to register to vote or change party affiliation before the 2021 Municipal Election.

**Note**: If you register to vote by mail, the signed voter registration form <u>must be received</u> by your county election office **15 days before an election**; that is, by October 18<sup>th</sup>, 2021 for the Fall Municipal Election.

October 26<sup>th</sup> — Last day to apply for a mail-in or civilian absentee ballot for the 2021 Municipal Election.

**Note**: If you apply for a mail-in ballot by mail, the mail-in ballot application must be received by your county election office by 5:00pm on this date.

# $November\ 2^{nd} - - \ \text{MUNICIPAL ELECTION}$

In-Person voting: Polls open from 7:00am to 8:00 pm

Last day for County Board of Elections to receive voted mail-in and civilian absentee ballots, in person or by mail, by 8:p.m.

**November 3<sup>rd</sup>** — First day to register after the Municipal Election

**November 9**th — Last day for County Board of Elections to receive voted military and overseas absentee ballots for the Fall Municipal Election

**Note**: If you vote a military or overseas absentee ballot, the absentee ballot must be submitted.
