## Distribution List Manager

Here's another opportunity for you to get involved with your League. We are looking for someone to manage the distribution of our publications.

The Voter Services Committee needs a **Distribution List Manager**.

Qualifications: Since we already have an established list of volunteers, the main job is to maintain the distributors' lists which we use to distribute the semi-annual Voters Guide and the yearly Facts for Voters. The manager will contact volunteers through email and phone calls. S/he will also need to contact LWVLA members to fill vacancies. This position offers a chance to get to know and talk with members. The Distribution Manager will communicate with distributors three times per year at least eight weeks before the two election cycles and before the disbursal date of the Facts for Voters to determine their availability. Very basic knowledge of Excel would be helpful. Training is available.
