NOVEMBER FORUM

The League of Women Voters of the Lewisburg Area held the November 19th Forum at the Union County Public Library. Dr. Kyle Kopko from the Center for Rural Pennsylvania spoke about population shifts and trends in Pennsylvania.

Dr. Kopko is the chair of the Rural Revitalization Commission. Their mission is to revitalize the rural population in Pennsylvania. The Commission was created in 2024 by bipartisan consensus. Dr. Kopko described the organization and the composition of the board. During their preliminary work, they have talked to a number of other countries who have faced rural depopulation problems, fifteen to twenty years earlier than Pennsylvania.

Dr. Kopko spent most of his talk discussing the various demographic factors that illustrate the depopulation problem faced by all areas of Pennsylvania, with the exception of the southeastern corner of the state. He placed particular emphasis on the declining birthrate and people migrating out of the state. The presentation was well attended.

Our Voter Services Committee successfully completed our voter education activities thanks to so many of you.

Vote411.org

<u>Vote411.org</u>, the National League's website with candidate and voter information, continues to educate more voters every year.

Our local League has been a member of Vote411 since 2019. We use it to provide content for our local *Voters Guide*. The *Voters Guide* Editor, Sheri Stayton, became the PA statewide Vote411 manager in 2020. She works along with *Voters Guide* staff member, Liz Clement, who has tracked down non-responding candidates and encouraged them to respond to Vote411.

Here are the statistics for **VOTE411**:

- National Statistics: 9.19 million used Vote411 (a 50% increase over 2020). More than 55,000 candidates in almost 29,000 races were covered.
- Pennsylvania Statistics:

2020 - 139,527 users

2022 - 189,831 users

2024 – 313,475 users

(The numbers may not be directly comparable because the way it is measured keeps changing, but there's a definite trend here.)
