VOTER SERVICES REPORT

Upcoming Election

The **Municipal Primary** will occur on May 16th, 2023

As explained in the February 2022 League Line article, "Your Vote Matters – But Do You Know Why," the 2021 Fall election was a close race. Local races in particular can be extremely close, which makes each individual vote essential in determining the final outcome. According to the Union County Elections Office report on the Fall 2021 election results, the New Berlin Borough Council, Lewisburg Borough Council Ward 4, and Lewisburg School Board elections were determined by less than 25 votes each. Also, for the Mifflinburg School Board, the president who was running unopposed received only 6 more votes than write-in candidates. You have the chance within four short months to make your voice heard again when you vote.

Some of the races in the upcoming election include:

- Union County: Commissioners, District Attorney
- Local Judiciary: Mifflinburg Magisterial District Judge
- Township Supervisors: Buffalo Twp, Gregg Twp, Hartley, Kelly, Limestone, Union, West Buffalo, and White Deer
- Borough Councils: Hartleton, Lewisburg, Mifflinburg, and New Berlin
- School Directors: Lewisburg and Mifflinburg

These candidates will directly affect your day-to-day lives. If we have contested races (more than one candidate running in a race), they will be invited to a <u>Candidates Night</u>. We hope they agree to attend so they can answer your submitted questions. I urge you to encourage candidates to respond to our invitation to participate in Candidates Night.
