#### FROM THE PRESIDENT

The 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebrations continue! How wonderful to celebrate our foremothers' and forefathers' actions which gained women the right to vote and led Carrie Chapman Catt to create the League of Women Voters. I hope to see you at our March 8<sup>th</sup> Campus Theatre event, appropriate for all ages. It's "not to be missed"! And please be sure to check out the exhibit at the Union County Library on our Lewisburg League History. Your League Board and Committee members are hard at work, and yes, we are having fun!

Census action is a US League priority with the pace picking up now. The Census rolls out mid-March and for the first time, responses will primarily be collected online. Residents may opt to phone in their responses or use a paper mail-in form to complete the national survey, but many will use computers and smart devices.

Significant community organizing and advocacy on the US Census is expected in the coming months. The League is deploying a 3-part supportive approach: a focus on education, Get Out the Count, and watchdog advocacy. Getting an accurate count is important as the numbers determine our representation in the US Congress and boundaries of voting districts, as well as the amount of government funding available for social services, public safety, and infrastructure. Census data identify community needs and offer a truer understanding of who makes up our community. Check out this good overview of "What's at Stake". Census takers here in Union County and surrounding counties are sorely needed and the job pay is fair (\$17.50/hr.). February's Board meeting was a big milestone for our LWVLA strategy. With the benefit of 2019-2020 strategy workshops, research, member focus groups, member 'town halls,' informal discussions, and Board discernment, a Vision and Priorities were approved, subject to member ratification in May at the Annual Meeting.

#### LWVLA Vision (subject to member ratification)

We envision increased Union County voter registration, voter turnout, and informed participation in local democracy. Over the next five years, LWVLA will build on our history and strengths to:

- be a trusted local leader in voter and issues education
- have members and collaborations that reflect the diversity of Union County
- actively collaborate with political, governmental and community organizations

# 2020-2025 Priorities (subject to member ratification)

- Increase voter registration and voter turnout
- Collaborate to increase League reach and impact
- Use technology to increase access to civics information and participation
- Design/implement civics education
- Design/implement voter education on issues
- Provide a venue for issue consensus, advocacy and activism
- Increase number of candidates running for office
