Kim Wheeler of SEDA-COG spoke to the League of Women Voters of the Lewisburg Area on February 20th, 2024, on the topic of What's Happening in the World of Economic Development. She stated there had been little innovative thought in economic development until recently. Now, however, there is a new model which relies on an entrepreneurial approach. For the last twenty years Pennsylvania had no economic development plan. Currently, Governor Shapiro is creating one to align with the newly presented budget. Ms. Wheeler spoke at length about how our area is well positioned to gain from the new economic development approach, giving particular emphasis to the amount of help Bucknell has provided.
