## MARCH FORUM

The March Forum of the League of Women Voters of the Lewisburg Area was held via zoom and in person at the Union County Public Library. Dana Purvis, Associate Dean of the Law School at Penn State University spoke on Roe v. Wade, the Dobbs decision, and the right to privacy.

Professor Purvis began by giving an extensive history of the right to privacy going back to the original decision in Griswald v. Connecticut. She discussed the basis of Roe v. Wade as a right to privacy which is not mentioned in the Constitution but was accepted as a traditional right. There was a great deal of interesting information about how the court came to that position. Professor Purvis presented a lengthy dissection of Justice Alito's opinion in the Dobbs decision, how that opinion removed the concept of the right to privacy as a constitutionally protected right, and what the implications of that decision were for areas such as the right to contraception and the right to same sex marriage.

This is a very cursory survey of an extremely informative presentation. Members are urged to go to the LWVLA website to view the presentation in its entirety at:
