President's Message Tom Drucker



The year 2015 brings with it several anniversaries, none perhaps of greater importance for the League and our mission than the 800th anniversary of the signing of Magna Carta. We know that this is not exactly the model for the legal and political system of the twenty-first century, but it has remained one of the landmarks on the path between feudalism and contemporary society. King John may have been forced to sign it against his will and the barons made sure that they were given pride of place, yet many of the protections that we enjoy against unwarranted intrusions into our lives and beliefs find their first expression in Magna Carta.

Last month's program by Prof. Jonah Ralston of the Department of Political Science at UW-Whitewater was a fitting sequel to the fall program on the issue of redistricting by members of the legislature. We have seen the maps of Wisconsin's electoral districts and we have heard about the consequences for voters to have the chance to influence the result of elections via the ballot box. On a state and national level, the League can make sure that legislators are aware that the public knows how much perpetuation of the status quo is guaranteed.

At last month's Board meeting, Ellen Penwell agreed to take on the portfolio of Voter Services for the Whitewater League. We have not officially had such a position before, but there will be advantages to having programs like voter registration and candidates' forums in one pair of hands. We also accepted with regret L.D. Rockwell's resignation from the Board. Our thanks to L.D. for his work in putting on the fall candidates' forum and his ongoing support of the local League. The Board plans to appoint a replacement at its February meeting.

Governor Walker presented some of the details for the proposed biennial budget during his recent address last week. It will be a challenge to balance deficits with the welfare of our citizens in the state of Wisconsin. The League's programs and activities will be designed over the next year to help inform our citizens about the effects and consequences of these legislative actions.
