MESSAGE FROM THE STEERING COMMITTEE

When there is no candidate for President, or no sitting President, the Board of Directors ("Board") of the Falmouth League nominates a Steering Committee drawn from the Board to perform the duties of the President. The Steering Committee shall not exceed 5 voting members and is elected by the general membership at the Annual Meeting for a term of one year. The Steering Committee meets as necessary prior to each regular Board meeting to make recommendations to the Board on matters of policy, procedure and concern.

The March 2019 Steering Committee meeting focused on the upcoming Annual Meeting set for Saturday, May 4^{th,} 11am-2pm at the Falmouth Historical Society. **Volunteer Power** is our theme. Selectman Susan Moran will speak on volunteerism in Falmouth following a buffet lunch. The agenda for includes a review of our League's volunteer committees. Every committee is composed of a minimum of three members. At the Annual Meeting, Committee tables will be set with a chairperson at each table. You do not want to miss this event since **YOU** are the power of the League.

The Steering Committee has suggested to the Board that the September 2019 meeting be the kickoff for the League's celebration of a double centennial—the 100thanniversaries of the passage of the 19thAmendment and the founding of the national League of Women Voters. A committee has been formed to work this summer on ideas for the yearlong celebration. Come up with some ideas and share them with the committee, who will be introduced at the Annual Meeting.

The Local Study Committee, completing its year-long study of seven Town of Falmouth appointed volunteer committees, will request another year to continue this work. The local Study Committee will make its presentation at the Town Hall Civil Defense Room on Thursday April 18th at 7pm.

Other events of note: Several League members are attending an educational Tea at the Waldorf School called "Hats off to Women" celebrating the history of the women's suffrage movement. Joanne Treistman was a judge for the LWVMA Video contest, reviewing 95 submitted 30 second PSA's for the Climate Change Challenge. Falmouth High School students' video "Climate Change" received an Honorable Mention and will be honored April 11th at the State House.

NEW CIVICS LAW LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM

The Legislative Committee program, "Falmouth Schools Welcome New Civics Education Law," was presented in the Hermann Room on March 20 before an enthusiastic audience of League members and members of the community. After Sylvia Szulkin's welcoming remarks, Legislative Committee Chair Judy Ziss introduced the program and then turned the podium over to Dr. Sonia Tellier, Assistant Superintendent of the Falmouth Public Schools.

Dr. Tellier, along with Social Studies Department Head Michael Feeney and Anna Dunphy, Project Manager of the Office of Teaching and Learning, presented a power-point program detailing civics studies in the Falmouth Public Schools, the integration of civics concepts into classroom activities, and especially changes expected as a result of the new state law. The power-point presentation was followed by a panel discussion moderated by Dr. Tellier. James Deasy, a seventh- grade teacher at the Lawrence School, joined Social Studies Department Head Michael Feeney, and two very poised and engaged young people, high school senior Michaela McCarthy and eighth grade student Alexia Morton.

During the program, the participants emphasized one of the highlights

of the new law ("An Act to Promote and Enhance Civic Engagement"). This is a mandatory program for all eighth graders in which they participate in a hands-on civics project. As Mr. Feeney emphasized, this project should promote a student's ability to analyze complex issues, consider differing points of view, make logical, evidence-

based arguments, engage in civil discourse, and demonstrate an understanding of the way issues and policies interconnect. Although a high school project also is required, here the Falmouth Public Schools will be able to build on the current senior project requirement at Falmouth High School rather than introduce an entirely new program. During the evening, the participants demonstrated their professionalism in the pursuit of civics education. It also seemed clear that their hearts were devoted to civics education along with the hearts of the so many members of the audience.

The program was capped off by short presentations by State Senator Vinny deMacedo and State Representative David Vieira. Both confirmed their views of the importance of civics education, with David contributing local stories about civics educational here in Falmouth. Judy Ziss asked that we contact the new Chairs of the joint Senate and House Ways and Means Committee to request funding for the Civics Project Trust Fund established by the new law. All three of our legislators have indicated that they will

support funding. The Massachusetts Civic Learning Coalition, of which the Massachusetts League is a member, is lobbying for a \$1.5 million appropriation to go to this fund.


ANNUAL MEETING MAY 4, 2019

He is the Schumann Distinguished Scholar in Environmental Studies at Middlebury College and a former staff writer for the *New Yorker* who continues to write numerous magazine articles.

White Ribbon Day, March 19th, was celebrated at the Falmouth Library. White Ribbon Campaign was created by Canadian men in 1991 on the second anniversary of one man's massacre of fourteen women in Montreal. The Falmouth Campaign was endorsed by a broad range of community groups including the LWVF and the Board of Selectmen. The WRC is a worldwide campaign in 60 countries that has collected well over 5 million signatures and growing. The goal is to raise awareness to encourage men to celebrate positive masculinity and positive maleness as a place where men do not condone, commit or tolerate violence against women.
