...125,000 Ohio voters were purged from the voting roles On February 21st. A searchable list of those removed can be found on the [Ohio Registration Readiness](#) website, and you can always find your registration status and details on the [Voter Search](#) page on the Ohio Secretary of State page.

...You must use a state issued ID to vote?

...State ID cards are now FREE for eligible Ohioans.
House Bill 458 changes several things about elections and how people can vote in the state of Ohio. The most notable change is the requirement to show a photo ID to cast a ballot on Election Day.

...Charles Norman is the Ohio Registrar of Motor Vehicles. He said this bill also makes state IDs free.

...Deadline to Register to Vote: April 3.

...Register to Vote or Update Your Registration: <https://olvr.ohiosos.gov/>

...EVERY Ohioan should regularly confirm that they are properly registered to vote: <https://voterlookup.ohiosos.gov/voterlookup.aspx>

...Early In-Person Voting: Began April 4 and includes the Saturday and Sunday before Election Day.

...Absentee Voting By Mail: Began April 4.

...Deadline for absentee ballot applications to be received by county Boards of Elections: April 25.

...Deadline to postmark your mail ballot: May 1 (AND it must be received by the Board of Elections by May 6).

...Election Day: May 2 (Polls Open 6:30 a.m. - 7:30 p.m.).

...Deadline for mail ballots to be personally delivered to your County Board of Elections: May 2, 7:30 PM.

...Deadline for boards to receive mail-ballots that have been postmarked on or before May 1.

PHOTO ID:

New Requirement for In-Person Voting:
Voters must have acceptable, unexpired Photo ID

Valid forms of photo ID:

- Ohio Driver's License
(including temporary, suspended or restricted)
- Ohio ID Card
- US Military ID
- US Dept. of Veterans Affairs ID card
- Ohio issued National Guard ID
- US Passport

Free Photo IDs*

A BMV issued state ID card is now FREE of charge for any resident of Ohio at least 17 years of age.

*you cannot hold a license or ID from another state.

Absentee Ballots May Be Returned by Mail
or
Personally Delivered to Your County Board of Elections

IMPORTANT DATES:

April 25:
Absentee ballot applications must be received by your board of elections by 8:30 p.m.

May 1:
Mailed absentee ballots must be postmarked.

May 2:
If not returned by mail, absentee ballots must be received by your board of elections by 7:30 p.m.

May 6:
Last day for board of elections to receive mail-in ballots that have been postmarked on or before May 1.

NOTE:
You can still use the last four digits of your Social Security Number as a form of ID to vote by mail.
