



Concord Annual Town Meeting 2026 – League Recommendations

The Board of the League of Women Voters of Concord-Carlisle makes the following recommendations, based on the general positions achieved by the League through its process of study and consensus and on the applicability of those positions to the Articles presented here.

Article 10: Town Operating Budget	Recommend a Yes vote.
Article 11 Town Capital Budget	Recommend a Yes vote.
Article 12: Municipal Facilities Planning	Recommend a Yes vote. Essential to the prudent planning of municipal resources.
Article 13: Concord Public Schools Operating Budget	Recommend a Yes vote.
Article 14: Concord Public Schools Capital Budget	Recommend a Yes vote.
Article 15: Concord-Carlisle Regional School District Operating Budget	Recommend a Yes vote.
Article 16: Establish Special Ed Reserve Fund	Recommend a Yes vote.
Article 17: Minuteman Regional Technical School District Budget	Recommend a Yes vote.
Article 19: Establish Capital Stabilization Fund	Recommend a Yes vote.
Article 20: Appropriate to Capital Stabilization Fund	Recommend a Yes vote.
Article 25: Adopt Conservation Fund ByLaw	Recommend a Yes vote.
Article 26: Community Preservation Appropriation	Recommend a Yes vote.
Article 30: Citizen Petition Solar on Municipal Buildings	Recommend a Yes vote on the amended Warrant Article that asks the Select Board to establish a Policy (instead of a ByLaw).
Article 32: Exterior Lightning ByLaw	Recommend a Yes vote.

Article 33: MBTA Communities Zoning	Recommend a Yes vote.
Article 34: Mixed Use Zoning Amendment	Recommend a Yes vote.
Article 35: Wireless Communication Zoning	The League has no specific policy or study on wireless communication on which to take a position.
Article 36: Joint Parking Zoning	Recommend a Yes vote.
Article 42: Citizen Petition on Composting	Recommend a Yes vote with particular appreciation for the student engagement with this article. The League encourages residents to consider composting options currently available.
