# Levels of Government (Federal, State and Local)

- Produces currency, regulates taxes, establishes federal welfare programs and foreign policy
- Oversees defense of the country and makes laws that affect the nation as a whole
- Ensures cooperation of state and local governments by providing funds to operate federal programs
  - All powers not granted to Federal Government are reserved for the States (10<sup>th</sup> Amendment to Constitution)
  - Oversees the affairs within state borders

State

Local

- Raises income taxes and oversees state welfare programs
- Control the state criminal code, maintains state roads and carries out federal programs at the state level

- States are divided into areas which carry out state laws within a specific geographic location
- Cities, towns and counties are granted specific powers by the state
- Local government responsibilities include managing public services, such as parks, libraries, schools, police and fire services



# Federal Government Structure

The US Constitution divides Federal Government into three branches:

# Executive Branch

- President, Vice President and the Cabinet – and various departments and agencies
- Responsible for enforcing the laws of the land

# Legislative Branch

- Congress (Senate and House of Representatives) and the agencies and offices that provide support services to Congress
- Makes all laws, declares war, regulates interstate and foreign commerce and taxing and spending policies

# Judicial Branch

- US Supreme Court and the Federal Judiciary
- Interprets Laws



# **Constituent Services**

**Constituent Services:** non-legislative activities provided by Members of Congress (may vary by member office):

- Federal Agency Assistance
- Federal Grant Information and Assistance
- Opportunities for Students: Internships
- US Service Academy Nominations (US Military Academy, US Naval Academy, US Air Force Academy, or US Merchant Marine Academy)
- Community Project Funding
- Assisting with Washington D.C. visits US Capitol Tours, Capitol Visitor Center, White House Tours and Other Sites
- Commemorations and Recognitions
- Flag Requests to obtain a US flag flown over the Capitol for purchase



# **Electing the President; the Electoral College**

The Electoral College – decides who will be elected president and vice president

- Each state gets as many electors as it has members in Congress (Senate and House of Representatives)
- Each state's political parties choose their own slate of potential electors
- In Massachusetts voters chose electors to represent them in the Electoral College via popular vote of the Candidate running for President/VP
- Massachusetts has 11 electoral votes in the Electoral College





## **Massachusetts State Government**




## What does the Massachusetts Legislature do?

- Discuss and vote on proposed laws
- Approve State budget
- Establish the courts
- Oversight over State Agencies
- Can override governor's veto with 2/3 vote
- Legislators provide constituent services and support the cities and towns in their district

## **MyLegislature** (visit <u>www.MALegislature.gov</u> to create an account)

Platform created by the Massachusetts Legislature to provide constituents with access to information. Some of the features include:

- Allows you to get notified of scheduling changes for hearings
- Follow your legislators, follow their bills and committee memberships
- Get suggestions on what bills could be relevant to you based on your interest

# **Hamilton and Wenham Town Government**

## **SELECT BOARD**

- The Board acts as the chief policy making body of the Town and directly supervises the activities of the Town Manager.
- May employ town administrators, including a town manager, to oversee the day-to-day business of the town
- Town Manager is responsible for supervising the day-to-day operation of all town departments falling under the direct control of the Select Board.
- Meetings are open to the public (some exceptions for sensitive matters)/ recorded by HWCAM

## **<u>TOWN MEETING</u>** (carryover from colonial period)

- The annual Town Meeting makes rules, adopts budgets, adopts bylaws and does a town's business
- Every voter in town may participate
- Agenda is called a warrant, and the elected town moderator conducts the Town Meeting

# Making an Impact by Voting

**VOTE411.org:** Launched by League of Women Voters Education Fund as a "one-stop-shop" for election related information. Provides nonpartisan information to the public with both general and state specific information:

- > Absentee ballot information
- > Ballot measure information (where applicable)
- > Early voting options (where applicable)
- Election dates
- > Factual data on candidates in various federal, state and local races
- > General information on such topics as to how to watch debates with a critical eye
- > ID requirements
- Polling place locations
- > Registration deadlines
- > Voter qualifications
- Voter registration forms
- Voting machines



# <u>Massachusetts – Making an Impact by Voting</u>

## **Voters' Bill of Rights**

• Jointly signed by the Secretary of the Commonwealth William F. Galvin and the President of the League of Women Voters of Massachusetts – to establish clear voting rights available to all qualified registered voters in Massachusetts

## Lists rights of all Massachusetts voters – including:

- Right to vote in privacy
- Right to cast a provisional ballot if you are not on the voters' list
- Right to a replacement ballot if an error is made while marking a ballot
