

The League of Women Voters of the Lewisburg Area encourages all citizens to register and vote in the upcoming Primary General Election to be held on June 2. Here are some deadlines that are important to know about for this election.

May 18, 2020- Last day to register to vote. You must be registered in the Democratic or Republican party to vote in this election. All other registered voters can vote on ballot questions in a primary. However, there are no ballot questions for Union County voters so only Democratic and Republican voters will vote. If you do not vote in Union County, and you are uncertain if there is a ballot question in your county, contact your local elections office. May 26, 2020 5 pm- Last day to apply for an application to vote by a mail-in or an absentee ballot. The deadline is 5 pm for receipt of these requests. Postmarks do not count. Act 77, passed in October 2019, now allows no-excuse mail-in ballots in Pennsylvania. The provisions of the new Pennsylvania law have opened access to easier participation in elections of our government officials, which is especially important during these uncertain times. As a non-partisan organization that neither supports nor endorses candidates or political parties, LWV educates voters on issues and opportunities associated with getting citizens involved in our government. The League of Women Voters encourages you to consider voting by mail for the June 2 Primary Election either by mail-in or absentee ballot. Adhering to "sheltering in place health orders," submitting your absentee or mail-in ballot application by mail, and voting by mail are safer than voting in person. If you are voting by mail-in or absentee ballot, your completed ballot must be received by your county elections office by 8 pm on June 2. Postmarks do not count.
