A March for Justice, Peace and Voting Rights

The Freedom to Vote Acts protect and stabilize our democracy by protecting voting rights. The United States Senate must act to pass the Freedom to Vote and the John R. Lewis Voting rights Advancement Acts, both of which set national standards for us to safely and freely cast our ballots, ensure every vote is counted, and elect people who will deliver for us. Our country is facing an unprecedented challenge to voting rights. Nineteen states have passed 33 laws restricting voting rights in 2021, and more are likely to come as legislatures convene next year. Our freedom to vote is under attack by state lawmakers across the country who want to put up deliberate barriers to make it harder to vote—especially for people of color. Concurrently those same state lawmakers are drawing partisan legislative maps to choose which voters they represent, instead of the other way around. Without first safeguarding our democracy to ensure that all Americans' voices are heard, we will not be able to make progress on the other issues impacting our lives and communities. We urge Senators Coons and Carper to do whatever it takes to deliver these bills to the American people. We also urge our state leaders to support HB75.
