Who We Are

The League of Women Voters, a nonpartisan political organization, has fought nationally since 1920, and in Oakland since 1924, to improve our systems of government and impact public policies through citizen education and advocacy. The League's enduring vitality and resonance comes from its unique decentralized structure. The League is a grassroots organization, working at the national, state and local levels.

There are Leagues in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, and Hong Kong, in addition to the hundreds of local Leagues nationwide.

The League of Women Voters is nonpartisan. We do not support or oppose candidates.

While we never endorse a candidate or party, we are directly involved in shaping important issues, sometimes taking positions after study and coming to consensus. In this way, the League is wholeheartedly political and works to influence policy through advocacy.

What We Do

We work to make our communities fair, vibrant, and strong. League programs focus on the key indicators of a healthy democracy, including voter participation, civic education and knowledge, and diversity of representation.

We provide trusted, nonpartisan and grassroots leadership.

Oakland League members collectively volunteer thousands of hours each year.

Our members:

- research local ballot measures
- distribute non-partisan information on both local and state elections
- register voters
- post election information on the internet
- facilitate discussions on issues
- train community leaders to educate others on their election choices
- organize televised candidate and issue debates

LWV Oakland produces the only non-partisan voter guide for Oakland voters, the *Oakland Easy Voter Guide*, with information about the candidates and ballot measures. The information is available in 3 languages—English, Spanish and Chinese—and is distributed at no cost to voters.
