As part of our 100-year celebration of women's suffrage and the establishment of the League of Women Voters nationally, the Ventura County Board of Supervisors presented the LWVVC with a proclamation acknowledging February 14, 2020 as "**League of Women Voter's Day**." The date was chosen by the LWV US because it is Susan B. Anthony's birthday.



Continuing the year-long celebration, we co-hosted a screening of "On the Basis of Sex" at the County Museum of Ventura with the Ventura Film Society. Dawn Dyer's Vision 2020-Ventura players performed "Use Your Voice! Use Your Vote!!!", a Suffrage Passion Play in One Act" before the screening.


