2020 Citizens Redistricting Commission - Every ten years, after the federal census, California must re-



establish the boundaries of its Congressional, State Senate, State Assembly, and State Board of Equalization districts to reflect new population data and shifting populations. The Voters FIRST Act gave this power to California citizens ensuring that new and fair political boundaries are drawn without special interests, politics and political influence.

California citizens who are eligible may submit an application to the California State Auditor's Office during the initial 60-day application period from June 10, 2019, to August 9, 2019.

This is your chance to become a part of creating fair and transparent district boundaries that serve the best interests of the people of California. If you believe politics are better when all sides work together and you have a passion for civic engagement, apply to become one of 14 new 2020 commissioners. ## **NEWS FROM OTHER CA LEAGUE CHAPTERS**



### **Monthly LWV California Membership Call**

Each month a conference call with the Jeanne Brown of the LWV California is held for all the Membership Directors in the State who want to participate. We discuss what is impacting membership, how we are meeting the goals of the CA and US Leagues, and other topics of interest.

There were discussions of a wide range of subjects this month:

- Program Planning Topics that were put forward to the CA and U.S. Leagues included ground
  water in Marin County, climate change and sea level rise in Freemont, low income housing,
  elimination of the Electoral College, healthcare for all/Medicare for all, removing money from
  politics, and more.
- **2020 Census** Leagues are working with their local 2020 Complete Count Committees. Several are hoping to have mobile units to go into areas without much computer access.
- **ERA Passage** The Bay Area Leagues are having an event in August to bring attention that the ERA has not yet been ratified.
- Restorative Justice Program Restorative justice is an approach to justice in which the response to a crime is to organize a meeting between the victim and the offender, sometimes with representatives of the wider community. The goal is for them to share their experience of what happened, to discuss who was harmed by the crime and how, and to create a consensus for what the offender can do to repair the harm from the offense. Some Leagues are working with District Attorneys, Public Defenders and the Probation Office to encourage supporting this process. They have met with resistance from judges and police officers.



• Types of Membership – For other Leagues, an Associate Member is someone belonging to multiple Leagues at no charge after their home chapter. Some chapters have high school Interns who are paired with a board member and attend events. This was determined to be non-productive in developing long-term members because the students move away upon graduation. However, it educates and develops awareness over the long run. Seeking college Student Members was seen to have the same results as Interns.
