THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



LWVUS has supported and pushed for ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) since the 1970s. The amendment was introduced by suffragist Alice Paul in 1923, 100 years ago, and its passage is supported by approximately 75% of Americans. Disappointingly, this past Thursday, the US Senate blocked a procedural measure on a joint resolution to remove an expired deadline for states to ratify the ERA. Please see an *excerpt* from

a statement issued by LWVUS CEO Virginia Kase Solomon:

"Today is a disappointing day for women. Our nation's elected leaders have failed yet again to see us as equal members of this democracy. It is shameful that despite the significant advances made in recent history, Americans continue to face discrimination on the basis of sex and lack equal rights in the Constitution. Inequality hurts everyone, and we must not continue to be a nation that harmfully excludes and marginalizes women."

The League will continue to advocate for passage of the ERA. Your local league will continue to keep you informed about ways in which all of us can advocate for the passage of this important amendment.

More locally, many league members, along with other interested citizens and organizations, participated in a zoom meeting regarding the recent repeal of the Ventura County Campaign Finance ordinance. The consensus was that having a local ordinance is a top priority and that the prior ordinance could be improved upon. Interested league members could be involved in reviewing existing ordinances and helping to develop a new ordinance for our county which could be submitted to the Board of Supervisors.

Other endeavors by league members could be expanding our educational and getout-the vote efforts, writing letters to the editor, and making public comments at, or observing, the Board of Supervisors' Meetings. I have spent two mornings this past month observing at the BOS meetings and found them to be very interesting and learned a lot about various efforts around the county. Please mark your calendars for June 10th and save the date for our Annual Meeting and luncheon. This is our biggest meeting of the year. We need everyone's participation as we vote on the proposed slate of new officers, our budget, and our programs for the upcoming year.
