# **ACTION** -SCHOOLS AND COMMUNITIES FIRST

It's official! The Schools and Communities First (SCF) initiative has qualified for the November ballot.

Opposition will be well funded. Scare tactics are anticipated. To combat this, we are being asked to make social media posts and to write letters to the editor (LTE) in support of SCF. Here are the key talking points:



- The state of California, along with local governments and school districts, is facing a budget crisis of historic proportions. Communities are faced with the prospect of devastating cuts to essential workers, local services, and schools. Now more than ever, those essential workers, critical local services, and schools deserve our support. The Schools & Communities First initiative does just that.
- The Schools & Communities First initiative will be key to California's
  recovery and reinvestment strategy, and the investments generated by
  this initiative represent vital resources that will go towards how California
  rebuilds after this crisis The initiative will generate \$12 billion every year
  for local governments and schools by closing corporate tax loopholes
  benefitting a fraction of those at the top, not nickel and diming
  Californians.
- Schools & Communities First protects homeowners and renters, small businesses, and agriculture from any changes. We cannot afford corporate tax loopholes at the expense of essential workers, critical local services, and schools.
- According to a University of Southern California study, 78% of the new revenue would come from only 6% of commercial and industrial properties – illustrating that a fraction of top corporations has overwhelmingly benefited from the current system.

# **UPDATE** - VOTE BY MAIL FOR ALL CA VOTERS

**Thank you** to those who wrote letters to our elected officials to press for Vote by Mail. California Governor Gavin Newsom signed an executive order May 8<sup>th</sup> to ensure every registered voter in the state is automatically mailed a ballot for the November presidential election. The executive order does not replace in-person voting. The state is still working to have an appropriate number of physical sites for people to vote as well.


California is the **first state in the nation** to automatically send voters their ballots ahead of the general election in response to the coronavirus.

As Congress works to address the COVID-19 health crisis, it is CRITICAL they include provisions to safeguard the right to vote in the upcoming November election. Contact Congress today and ask them to:

- Ensure funding and legislation to safeguard elections is included in the next stimulus bill.
- Adopt a National Vote-By-Mail Act, working for mail-in ballot options for all states before the November election, including removal of problematic restrictions and assurance of a paper trail for all.

This would encourage voting, assure recounts are feasible with paper ballots, and avoid polling places where health could be compromised.

You can do your part by calling on your Senators and Representatives to end voting discrimination in this county by repairing and modernizing the Voting Rights Act.
