Betsy Patterson, Jaxton Wright, and Kathy Morgan trained nine students in voter education & registration at Oxnard High School in prep for student-led voter registration drive on Sept 21st in Government and US History classes.



Matty Park and Carmen Hurd shared methods for engaging HS independent study students at Condor HS with all coach liaisons from all Oxnard high schools on September 15th.

During High School Voter Education Weeks in September, our volunteers visited 9 schools, encountered over 1,000 students and registered 221 students. We shared information about the history of voting in the US, talked with them about why voting might be important to them, a bit about the process of voting, and helped them register to vote if they wanted. Feedback from the students was positive at all schools and they offered some good ideas for ways we could improve our presentation.

We are still visiting schools and scheduling more events in the next few weeks, so we are always looking for more volunteers. Please consider signing up, even if you have never done this before - we will always have a trained League member there with you and we need help passing out voter registration forms, blue or black pens, or answering questions from the students. In the coming weeks we will visit Newbury Park High School (10/3/23) and we will be scheduling Rio Mesa HS and Channel Islands HS.

CA Legislative Action

Referendum Reform in California – SUCCESS!

Assembly Bill 421 was approved by the legislature and signed into law by Governor Newsom in September. The legislation is intended to reduce confusion about the outcome of voting "yes" or "no" on a referendum.

A referendum is a measure placed on the ballot with the intention of overturning a state law. The ballot title will no longer ask voters to choose between a "yes" or "no" vote but ask them whether California should "keep the law," or "overturn the law." The summary that follows will include the "purposes and points of the law proposed to be overturned."

Also, as of January 1, 2025, the title and summary will be followed by a listing of the names of supporters and opponents in the ballot arguments printed in the State Voter Information Guide.
