As of Oct 25th, 2023, our voter registration volunteers have presented to 2,162 students, registering 692 with 94 already registered. We had 20 volunteers attending 86 classrooms plus 3 tabling events (Oxnard High School quad at lunch). On Oct 31, we had a review and wrap-up session to discuss what went well and how we can improve our presentation and events. We hope to have more studentled events in the future with the League being the support team.

CA TRUTH Act (AB 2792) Forum on November 7th



Ventura County has scheduled its 2023 TRUTH Act (Transparent Review of Unjust Transfers and Holds Act) Forum at the County Board of Supervisors meeting at 3:00pm on No**vember 7**th. The TRUTH Act defines rights of immigrants held in local jails and requires that collaboration between local police and federal immigration enforcement is made transparent to the community. The TRUTH Act Forum is a

public hearing where Ventura County public safety agencies are required to report details of their collaboration with immigration enforcement and to receive and consider public comments.
