TODAY! Annual Town Town Meeting Prep Thursday March 21 @ 7pm

Huge thank you to Barbara McMahon for organizing our annual Town Meeting Prep session on Thursday March 21 at 7 pm at Wellesley's Police Station. The main goal of this event is to give Town Meeting members an opportunity to hear about the warrant articles slated for consideration at Town Meeting, on March 25-17 and April 1-3 at WHS. However, all residents are welcome. This is your chance to learn more about how our newly elected town officials and Town Meeting members are preparing for their local office.


Notable warrant articles this year include:

- A request for Community Preservation Act funds for the design of the Morses Pond bathhouse and beach (Article 17).
- A request for funding for a streetscape design of Wellesley Square (Article 23).
- The MBTA Communities Zoning Bylaw amendment (Article 40).
- A Zoning map amendment to add a Residential Incentive Overlay (RIO) to 194, 196 Worcester Street and 150 Cedar Street (Article 42).
- A Citizen Petition asking Town Meeting to authorize a Special Act to provide voting rights in local elections for residents 16 and 17 years old. (Article 48).

More information about the Town Meeting warrant articles is available from the Advisory Committee. Its annual report is available **here**. The committee is made up of 15 community members who are appointed by the Town Moderator to study warrant articles in detail and give background information and recommendations to Town Meeting members. The Advisory Committee report is sent to all Town Meeting members.

If you have signs in your yard concerning an issue, it's best to check with the board or president by email or phone/text at 781-591-2033 to see about whether LWVW/LWVMA/LWVUS have taken affirmative positions on your issue before putting out the LWV sign.


