Who Is Protecting Your Right to Read?

A Discussion with: Mary Ann Cluggish, Mass Board of Library Commissioners, and Jamie Jurgensen, Director, Wellesley Free Library

Across the nation, libraries are dealing with an increasing number of book challenges - demands to remove one or often multiple books from a library's collection, to prevent the books from being read or even accessed. The American Library Association reports a record number of 2,571 unique titles were challenged in 2022, a 38% increase from 2021. In Massachusetts, library disruptions and book challenges have quadrupled. The challenges are happening both in public and school libraries. Libraries have long been a cherished resource for any person to find information on any topic. Who decides what materials are on the shelves in our local and school libraries? What is the role of the State in ensuring our right to read? Legislation has been filed in Massachusetts to help limit book challenges and book banning in our state.
