Congratulations on your U.S. citizenship! You now have the right to vote, and we'd love to help you exercise that.

Election Day this year is November 5, 2024. Polls are open 6 AM – 7 PM.

Early Voting

Early Voting begins on September 20, 2024. The last day for early voting is Saturday, November 2, 2024 at 5:00 PM. Early voting will be available on Saturday, October 26, 2024 and all weekdays starting September 20, 2024.

You may be asked to affirm your citizenship

If the Department of Elections cross-checks your information with that sent to them by the DMV and determines you may not be a citizen, you will be notified by your local registrar. You will then have 14 days to respond affirming your citizenship. You can contact [your local registrar](#) to ask what information they would like you to send to affirm this and how to send it.
