## Minnesota Health Care and Affordability Program





The monthly program meeting on July 10 features State Senators Jim Abeler, District 35-R, and Carolyn Laine, District 41-D. They will discuss the potential for legislative action on Minnesota health care and medical affordability to Minnesota residents. The event begins at 6 p.m. with a light dinner at the Andover City Hall's Senior Center, 1685 Crosstown Boulevard NW, Andover. The program begins at 6:30 p.m.

Among Senator Abeler's senate committee appointments are <u>Aging and Long-</u> <u>Term Care Policy</u> and <u>Health and Human Services Finance and Policy</u>, which he chairs. Senator Laine is the Assistant Minority Leader. When she was a member of the State House of Representatives, she introduced a companion bill that proposed state-sponsored universal health care.

The Aging and Long-Term Care Policy Committee has jurisdiction over over all bills relating to long-term care, consequently potentially affects the lives of the Minnesota's elderly population. The Health and Human Services Policy committee has jurisdiction over all bills relating to health care and human services.

## HIGHLIGHTS OF THE LWV ABC BOARD JUNE 26 MEETING

The Board made final revisions to and approved a strategic plan to be presented to LWV ABC members for approval at the September 11, 2017 kickoff monthly meeting. LWV ABC members will receive the strategic plan in advance of the meeting. At the meeting, they will have an opportunity to ask questions and propose changes. After the strategic plan is approved, the Board will create benchmarks to achieve to accomplish the objectives in the plan.

## CAPITOL TOUR OF THE LEGISLATIVE PROCESS

On June 22, eleven LWV ABC members received a guided tour of offices and agencies useful to the public involved in the legislative process. Ken Pentel, a former Green Party of Minnesota chair and gubernatorial candidate who has established the <u>DemocracyEcologyNetwork</u>, served as tour guide. Mr. Pentel titles his tours, "An Activist's Tour of the Minnesota State Capitol and other Legislative Offices." This non-partisan tour focused on those offices and services that people need to effectively advocate at the Minnesota Legislature

The group learned about the services the public could use for research and writing proposed laws and various methods of meeting with legislators. They also learned the process of reserving rooms for meetings and press conferences. Additionally, they visited Legislative Reference Library and the area in the Capitol where the different news organization offices are located.

Our own Gretchen Sabel's home will be on the tour this year where you will see how managing a two-acre lot can be simplified, beautiful, and kept as a habitat for pollinators.
