President's Message

We've had a busy month at the League. What an amazing push by all Volunteer Deputy Registrars in the area to get as many people registered to vote as possible. Now comes the hard part, encouraging people to do their homework and get out to the polls. As we studied in our unit meetings last month, voter turnout is extremely low in Texas. When you open up your Voter's Guide, you will also see another related trend.

We appreciated the many candidates who fully participate in the democratic process. Unfortunately, there are some candidates that refuse to participate in voter education activities at the state and local levels.

When candidates refuse to participate in opportunities to help their future constituents learn more about their views and their ideas for the future of their local communities and Texas, this is a huge loss for Texas voters. This is a consistent trend that Leagues all over the state are experiencing.

Research conducted on voter behavior and participation shows that not only does the public expect candidates to participate in voter education activities, but also, that voters are more likely to vote when they know who the candidates are and where they stand on the issues. So when candidates choose not to participate, it's the voters that lose and our democracy that is harmed.

League members and voters can support democracy in Texas by encouraging candidates to reply to the League's Voters Guide questions and participate in debates and forums. I want to encourage all League members to support our democracy and take action by contacting candidates by phone, email or over social media. There is still time for candidates to respond to our nonpartisan online Voters Guide available at VOTE411.org.

Now to another piece of Tarrant County League news. I would like to express my utmost gratitude to Doris Sawey, our Administrative Assistant. Doris has submitted her resignation so that she can take better care of herself. Her last day in our office will be November 30. The board and I wish her well. Her skills have been so valuable to the League and she will be hard to replace. Please send her well-wishes and/or stop by the office to expression your appreciation.

As we begin a new year of Unit meetings, it is good to remind ourselves that LWV is a non-partisan organization. Our conversations need to be about the issues and not take on a partisan tone.

Many people feel like issues are partisan because political parties have become the champions for their point of view on that issue. Please remember that this is not how the LWV operates. League members do expensive study on a topic and only when there is a consensus reached do we publish a stance on an issue. This enables us to then advocate/lobby for our position on that issue.

For example, the League has this position on <u>public education funding:</u>

The League of Women Voters of Texas supports a school finance system that provides taxpayer equity and an equitable distribution of funds to ensure that all Texas school children receive a high-quality education.

If we feel like this is not happening then we can advocate/lobby for our position. Without this position we cannot speak about it as an organization. Some politicians have taken a stance on an issue but that does not make that issue partisan and those politicians do not affect our stance as a League.

Responses to Questions asked at September Unit Meetings

The topic in September was Promoting Voting. Thanks to our Mid-Cities for providing the following responses:

Question 1: Does the information on the state league's webpage cover promotion of voting adequately and effectively?

About half the group had visited the web site: https://my.lwv.org/texas/get-out-vote-0
Those who did though it is an extremely valuable resource. It is very thorough and although there is a tremendous amount of information it is very professionally done. Congratulations to the State League!

- Question 2: If yes, how? If not, what else is needed or could be better presented? There were no suggestions on improving it.
- Question 3: How can local LWV members, as individuals, best use this information to promote voting locally? Members should share this web site with friends and other organizations where they are involved. It is a tremendous resource for league members and we should promote it on our website and at Hot Topic Luncheons and whenever members gather, as appropriate. Perhaps at voter registrations?
- Question 4: What should LWV Tarrant do as an organization to promote voting locally? Group focused on ideas for LWVTC to have an impact on increasing voter turnout.
 - a. Promote on our web site and however possible the Lyft offer to provide free rides to the poles. A Unit member will research these possibilities
 - b. Investigate the possibility of being a partner with the group in South Lake that has run a "Why Vote" event successfully. They would be interested in the League's reputation and for the league they are an approach to those 44% who refuse to vote.
 - c. Develop and execute a plan to increase use of the Voters Guide in Tarrant County. Develop an initiative to get sponsors for the purchase of yard signs promoting Vote 411.

Yard signs can be distributed first to members and as the project expands to strategic neighborhoods and areas of the city. These may be stored in member garages for recurring use.

- d. Consider a postcard party targeting a neighborhood, apartment building, or other such group-inviting them to register and vote. (Example given was an ACLU postcard party where volunteers handwrite messages encouraging ACLU members to vote. The ACLU then addressed the cards and mailed them to their members. (Get Out the Vote Initiative)
- e. Consider having roving vans patriotically decorated circulating the city during early election promoting voting and offering rides to the polls. This would need sponsors.
- f. Be sure all voter registration by League members offer the reminder post cards to be filled out by those we register.
