PRIVACY AND CYBERSECURITY - A LWV OF OREGON STUDY

Privacy and Cybersecurity is based on a new study by the League of Women Voters of Oregon. This study was begun in May of 2019 and ended in February of 2020. The study began because there was a lack of a position in the League to support Oregon's identity theft bill, HB 1551, which was put forth to address the 2017 Equifax data breach.
