

All month we are celebrating African-American History, and wanted to share this blog post from LWV CEO Virginia Kase about her League Hero Shirley Chisholm.


Ms. Chisholm was the first Black Congresswoman, the first Black candidate for a major party's presidential nomination, and former @LWVNYC member.


