RECEIVE your Mail-In Ballot

IMPORTANT!

- Once your mail-in ballot application is accepted by the county Elections Office, you will RECEIVE a mail-in ballot in the postal mail.
- Mail-in ballots should be available starting in late September or October 1st.
- If you provided an email address when you applied, you can track the status of your mail-in ballot application on-line by clicking here.
- The mail-in ballot packet you RECEIVE will have:
 - * an instruction sheet
 - * the mail-in ballot
 - * the "secrecy" envelope
 - * the "Official Election" self-addressed return envelope
- If you did not RECEIVE your mail-in ballot OR if it is lost, damaged or destroyed, you can vote in person at your polling place on Election Day, using a provisional ballot.
