

RECEIVE your Mail-In Ballot

IMPORTANT!

- Once your **mail-in ballot application** is accepted by the county Elections Office, you will RECEIVE a **mail-in ballot** in the postal mail.
- **Mail-in ballots** should be available starting in late September or October 1st.
- If you provided an email address when you applied, you can track the status of your **mail-in ballot application** on-line by clicking [here](#).
- The **mail-in ballot** packet you RECEIVE will have:
 - * an instruction sheet
 - * the **mail-in ballot**
 - * the “secrecy” envelope
 - * the “Official Election” self-addressed return envelope
- If you did **not** RECEIVE your **mail-in ballot** OR if it is lost, damaged or destroyed, you can vote **in person** at your polling place on Election Day, using a **provisional ballot**.
