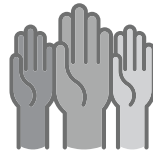


Reentry Voting Rights: You've Got the Power, It's the Law!

You can register to vote in California if you are:

- a US citizen & California resident
- 18 years old by Election Day
- Not in prison or on parole for a felony conviction

YOUR VOTING RIGHTS

Misdemeanor conviction:

You can **always** vote.

Felony conviction:

You can vote *if*:

- You are out of prison and off parole, or
- You are on probation, or
- You are on post-release community supervision; or on mandatory supervision; or on federal supervised release.

- Call the Secretary of State at 1-800-345-VOTE
- Pick up a form at Post Offices, Libraries, the DMV or the Alameda County Registrar of Voters, 1225 Fallon St., Oakland, CA 94612

If you're homeless, describe where you live using cross streets and provide a mailing address.

DEADLINE TO REGISTER TO VOTE

Last Day to Register

15 days before the next local, state or federal election

Conditional Registration

If you miss the 15-day deadline, you can register conditionally and vote up to Election Day at the Alameda County Registrar of Voters' Office.



REMINDER: You need to re-register when you move, change your name, or change political parties.
