

Resolution on Supporting the Commonwealth of Virginia's

joining the National Popular Vote Interstate Compact (NPVIC)

Whereas the League of Women Voters of the United States (LWVUS) has had a position on abolishing the Electoral College in favor of a one-person one-vote election of the President of the United States since 1970;

Whereas the LWVUS has had a position and has supported the use of the National Popular Vote Interstate Compact (NPVIC) since 2010 as a faster means of achieving one-person one vote;

Whereas the LWVUS kicked off the "Moonshot Project" at its 2024 national convention to achieve national one-person one-vote;

Whereas the League of Women Voters of Virginia (LWV VA) educated its members on these methods in a December 11, 2024, virtual meeting; and

Whereas the Virginia General Assembly has attempted multiple times since 2009 but not successfully gotten the NPVIC bills approved in both houses;


Therefore, be it

Resolved, that the LWV of Virginia on behalf of its members:


1. will encourage and support the passage of Virginia General Assembly (GA) bills that would add Virginia to the NPVIC; and
