A confidential voter can vote by mail and protect their voter registration information from campaigns, the media, and the general public.

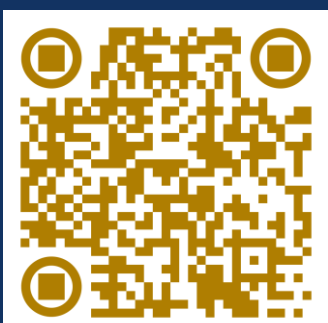

DESCRIPTION OF EVENT	Deadline*
Certified list of candidates for the June 7, 2022 Primary Election	Mar 31, 2022*
Online version of State Voter Information Guide Available	April 8, 2022
Secretary of State's office and County Election offices will mail the Voter Information Guides during this period	April 28 - May 17, 2022
No later than this date, county elections officials shall begin mailing each registered voter a vote-by-mail ballot	May 9, 2022
Early Voting sites are open	May 9 - June 6, 2022
By this date, all counties shall open ballot drop-off locations for vote-by-mail ballots. To find a location please visit: https://caearlyvoting.sos.ca.gov/	May 10 - June 7, 2022
Last day to register to vote for the primary election. To check your voter registration status visit MyVoterStatus	May 23, 2022
Same Day Registration available. Voters can "conditionally" register and vote a provisional ballot during this time	May 24 - June 7, 2022
Counties that are part of the Voter's Choice Act will open Vote Centers	May 28, 2022
Election Day - Polls shall be open throughout the state from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.	June 7, 2022
Election Results Returns, beginning at 8:00 p.m.	June 7, 2022, 8:00 p.m.
Vote by Mail ballot deadline to be delivered by the United States Postal Service as long as the vote-by-mail ballot is postmarked on or before Election Day	June 14, 2022

Elections and Voter Information VOTING RIGHTS RESTORED

Voting Rights: Persons with a Criminal History

Persons with a criminal history who can register to vote:

☐ In county jail:

- serving a misdemeanor sentence (a misdemeanor never affects your right to vote)
- Because jail time is a condition of probation (misdemeanor or felony)
- Serving a felony jail sentence
- Awaiting trial

☐ On parole, on probation, on mandatory supervision, on post-release community supervision, OR on federal supervised release

☐ A person with a juvenile wardship adjudication

Persons with a criminal history who cannot register and vote:

Currently serving a state or federal prison term for the conviction of a felony in State prison, Federal prison, OR County jail or other correctional facility*

*A person serving a state prison sentence who is housed in a local jail or other facility under these circumstances is not allowed to register and vote.

NOTE: Once you have finished serving your term, your right to vote is restored; however, you must register online at [RegisterToVote.ca.gov](https://www.sos.ca.gov/register-to-vote) or by filling out a paper voter registration card.
