

Kiss the Ground Documentary Film to be Shown at ICPL

It has been tough to beat the heat this summer. I wonder if that means the climate crisis has reached Iowa. And, if so, will Iowans recognize that we are nearing a tipping point? The environment is one of Iowa's greatest assets and should be protected more than it is.

While coordinating speakers for JCMG and Project GREEN, I learned about a documentary film. I worked with Beth Fisher at the Iowa City Public Library and a group of local nonprofit organizations to bring the film to Iowa City.

A free screening has been made possible by a grant from Roco Films.

The documentary film, *Kiss the Ground*, will be shown on Tuesday, September 19, at 7 p.m., in the Iowa City Public Library. The sponsors of the film are Project GREEN, the Iowa City Public Library, and nonprofit organizations concerned about the environment: 100 Grannies, Backyard Abundance, Bur Oak Land Trust, Johnson County Master Gardeners, and the League of Women Voters of Johnson County.

"Kiss the Ground is an inspiring and groundbreaking film narrated by and featuring Woody Harrelson. The film reveals the first viable solution to our climate crisis – by regenerating the world's soils, we can completely and rapidly stabilize the earth's climate, restore lost ecosystems and create abundant food supplies. Using compelling graphics and visuals, along with striking NASA and NOAA footage, the film artfully illustrates how, by drawing down atmospheric carbon, the soil is the missing piece of the climate puzzle. The movie is positioned to catalyze a movement to accomplish the impossible – to solve humanity's greatest challenge, to balance the climate and secure our species' future." https://kisstheground.com/

Advocacy

Hoping to build our advocacy effectiveness, the LWV of Iowa Advocates look to expand efforts statewide for greater impact with lawmakers. To better understand the 90th General Assembly following adjournment, LWVIA President Terese Grant contacted LWVUS to organize a Legislative debrief for the Iowa League membership. More than 60 Iowa League members attended the Iowa SWOT Analysis and Debrief held on May 10.

As a follow-up to the May SWOT meeting, LWVIA Treasurer/LWVJC Board member and Advocacy Chair Shannon Patrick was called on to present the first of four statewide education programs to assist Iowa League units and develop strength in our advocacy. His presentation, *Navigating the Iowa Legislative Website: Tracking Legislation*, covered: a) what information can be found on the data-rich Iowa Legislative website (<u>https://www.legis.iowa.gov/</u>), how to search for information and how to track proposed bills; b) who is connected to specific bills and how to find and contact legislators and others; and c) more how to follow the daily activities of the legislature, present information at Zoom hearings, and how to subscribe to specific publications, information and legislative newsletters.

Co-sponsored by LWVJC, LWV of Iowa Advocates and the Iowa City Public Library, the presentation was live streamed via the Library's YouTube channel with 30 people, in person and online, participating in Shannon's presentation. To review and share the session with other League members and partners, visit <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=bzsG5TxMoQE</u>. Shannon's step-by-step Powerpoint *Navigating the Iowa Legislative Website: Tracking Legislation* will be shared on the LWVJC and LWVIA websites.

LWV of Iowa Advocates plan to create a proactive plan of action to advocate for or against proposed legislation concerning League priorities. League members are encouraged to use a template to create an Action Alert that League Presidents across Iowa can distribute and encourage their members to contact legislators. League members are urged to summarize information and draft messages, and not simply forward partner information that may leave new League advocates to try figure out what to do and who to contact.

Additional programs scheduled this fall preceding the 2024 Legislative Session include:


