Courts and Consequences: Understanding Legal Power In the U.S. Today

Speaker: Tom Burke, Professor of Political Science, Wellesley College



Join us for an engaging evening with Wellesley College Professor Tom Burke as we explore the pivotal role courts play in shaping public policy. In an era of increasingly polarized legal conflict, Professor Burke will review how courts have responded to the current administration, and some of the consequences for critical policy areas like education, immigration and civil rights. In the Federalist Papers, Alexander Hamilton called the judiciary "the least dangerous

branch" because of its lack of power--but how powerful are courts today? What can judges do if they are worried that their decisions will be ignored or circumvented by other branches of government? Finally, we'll discuss the vital role organizations like the League of Women Voters play in educating the public about court decisions and their real-world impact. This timely conversation will illuminate the intersection of law, democracy, and civic engagement.

Update on the Coercive Control Bill



MASS FAMILY ADVOCACY COALITION

Working Together to Improve Family Court

Former LWVW board member Margie Palladino's non-profit Mass Family Advocacy Coalition (MFAC) held a Zoom presentation with the Massachusetts League of Women Voters on August 19th where some of their members shared their experiences with abusive litigation in family court. The presentation was reminiscent of the one that LWVMA and MFAC did for the Coercive Control bill which was signed into law by Governor Maura Healey on June 24, 2024. This bill, which was backed by LWVW, LWVMA, and a coalition of women's rights groups including Jane Doe, Inc., cracks down on coercive control by domestic abusers and bans revenge pornography in Massachusetts. With this bill, Massachusetts became just the seventh state in the country to pass legislation classifying coercive control as a form of domestic violence.

Margie comments:

"It is so inefficient for the divorce process to work this way and is costing families and taxpayers a tremendous amount. Most importantly for me, it leaves lasting scars on the children who are caught up in it. Bottom line: The system is way too adversarial, and the judges need tools and education to curb out-of-control adversarial conduct."

MFAC will be sponsoring a family law symposium on November 14, 2025 at Suffolk University Law School entitled Unequal Aftermath: Women's Economic Vulnerability During and Post Divorce. [Click here for further information and to register.](#)
