Working with the Hudson League, we offered a series of DEI workshops that were developed by the LWVUS. Hudson and Akron shared the presentation of these workshops and Jackie Derrow and Arrye Rosser were our League's presenters.

These workshops and all resources are available on our website. In as much as future planning will incorporate DEI initiatives, it behooves you to get up to speed on this program. Future DEI programing will be produced by a coalition of

Leagues (Akron, Cleveland, Hudson and Kent), and will center around DEI issues in public education, health care and the criminal justice system.

A second area of up-coming programing will **focus on redistricting**. Common Cause Ohio and LWVOH are spearheading this programming. Liz King and I will be members of the speaker's bureau.

LWVAA Feb 13 Positions & Priorities Meeting

New to the League? Wanting to learn more about the League's positions on issues? Once a year we gather - this year virtually - to review the League's Positions and Priorities.

The League's Positions on issues - from government to social justice and the environment - underlie all League advocacy. Without a position, we cannot take action on behalf of the League.

Last year we reviewed the LWVUS positions. This year we'll review a subset of the LWV Ohio positions under the umbrella of Social Policy, specifically Juvenile Justice, Primary and Secondary Education and Higher Education. Below is a 1-paragraph summary of each of these positions. To review all LWV Ohio positions, click here.

Our review can lead to studies and ultimately position revisions that, if supported by the membership and other Ohio leagues, can result in a vote at the LWV Ohio convention in May. This is grassroots democracy at its best.

LWV OHIO POSITION SUMMARY Primary and Secondary Education

Support the use of public funds only for public schools. Support an elected State

Board of Education whose responsibility is policy making/planning. Support state education standards as a method of attaining a high- quality education. Support state funding for education that guarantees a realistic and equitable level of perpupil expenditures, and support local school districts assuming a reasonable share of the financial burden.

Higher Education

Support funding by the state to ensure that all Ohio citizens have access to higher education that provides general education and job preparation. Support Board of Regents, appointed by the Governor with confirmation by the Senate, to be a planning, coordinating board with broad policy-making powers.

Juvenile Justice

Support community-based, least restrictive placement; rights and humane treatment of children who are juvenile offenders; alternative educational services; gender-specific treatment programs; unbiased treatment regardless of race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, disability, religion, or socio-economic status; statewide uniform standards for dealing with juvenile records. Oppose holding children in adult jails.


