2024 is a big election year and we could use your help. Remember that the League of Women Voters, nationwide, statewide and locally, does not support or oppose candidates for any political office. We do present forums for candidates so they can explain why they should be elected. Voters can then make their own decisions. The League, in some cases, does advocate for issues that have been agreed upon.

Either for aspiring office holders or for ballot initiatives, we want to be sure every voter has their own say. Do you want to assist with this effort? We especially need a couple of people to serve as Voter Services chairs on our board. Please help to make that happen!

DEMOCRACY WORKS - COMING SOON!

The Democracy Works award is scheduled to be presented on October 20, but we need nominations by *August 31*!

Every year our League presents its Democracy Works award to an individual and/or organization working to "empower voters and defend democracy". Nominees are being sought from throughout Yolo County whose actions support people and democratic processes. These actions may include encouraging equal representation, promoting free and fair elections, expanding voter education and rights, advocating legislation that promotes democracy and communities, or taking grassroots political action.

CLIMATE AND CONVERSATION

We're very excited that the first event of the year will be "Climate and Conservation," a review of Yolo County's 2030 Climate Action and Adaptation Plan (CAAP) at 7:00pm, Thursday, September 21, in Norton Hall (70 Cottonwood Street, Woodland).

Kristen Wraithwall, Yolo County's sustainability manager since 2022, will present information on the 2030 CAAP. The CAAP serves as a comprehensive road map identifying opportunities to achieve reductions in Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions, as well as to develop comprehensive strategies to respond to the growing effects of climate change on all people, industries and areas of Yolo County. Wraithwall, who holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from Harvard in environmental science and public policy and a Master of Science from Yale in environmental management, will discuss the Climate Action and Adaptation Plan process and timeline, its current survey, outreach efforts (especially to historically underserved communities), and regional collaborations and partnerships in California.

We urge members to attend as well as bring a guest to this free event where light refreshments will also be available. Donations are appreciated, of course, to make more programs like this possible.

Seating at Norton Hall is limited, so you are urged to send an email to **woodlandleaguenews@gmail.com** if you plan to attend and the size of your

party.

YOUR LEAGUE'S BUSY SUMMER By Lorna Carriveau

Our League is busy throughout the year – no summer vacation for our important work. This past June and July we hosted one event, tabled at two events and held a board of directors planning retreat.

Summer Solstice/Annual Meeting: We were very pleased with the strong turnout for our Summer Solstice presentation and dinner on June 21. The event took place at the historic Woodland Hotel and was catered by Cracchiolo's.

Among our many guests were Tania Garcia-Cadena, Woodland City Council member, and Armando Salud, Board of Education Trustee.

Dr. Mindy Romero, founder and director of the Center for Inclusive Democracy (CID), gave a detailed presentation on her organization's research into Yolo County voter participation during the 2016-2022 general elections. Results show that Yolo County's turnout of eligible voters is a bit higher than state-wide turnout even among demographic groups that traditionally are not as involved. CID tracks voter turnout based on race, ethnicity and age in particular. The method of voting was also tracked for Yolo County in the November 2022 election as follows: 55.4% drop box, 34+% mail-in, and 10+% at a drop-off location, such as a vote center. She provided excellent insights into voter preferences and opportunities to improve voter turnout.

Our Annual Meeting of members was held immediately after Dr. Romero's presentation. A quorum of 21 members voted to accept the Treasurer's Report and proposed 2023-2024 budget, Bylaws, Program, and slate of Officers and Directors.

In addition, President Karen Urbano thanked the current board and acknowledged the many volunteers who helped at tabling events, high school voter registration, the high school essay contest, and served on committees over the past year. She then announced that Christine Shewmaker was the recipient of the Grace Hefner award for her work this past year serving as the League's environment guide and resource.

Davis Pride and United Way/Yolo Family Festival Tabling Events : Lorna Carriveau represented our League at the Davis Pride celebration on June 4, helping colleagues at the Davis Area League table provide voter registration information. A particularly lovely moment occurred when Yolo County Elections Officer Jesse Salinas personally helped a young man register to vote with his family as proud witnesses. While most visitors to the table acknowledged already being registered and voting regularly, a few took advantage of the materials provided to start the process.

New member and board Secretary Faye Smith-Gee and Lorna also represented our League at the Yolo Family Festival event hosted by the United Way on July 15. The event celebrated both the United Way's 100th anniversary and graduates of KinderCamp, a United Way program created to take students who have not been to preschool and prepare them for kindergarten. As usual, we made a difference. One young man who recently became a U.S. citizen spoke of difficulty registering to vote. He was very pleased that we could provide materials and recommendations on resources available to help him.

Planning Retreat: The board of directors meets in August each year to plan for

the coming year. It's also an excellent opportunity for new board members to begin working with their colleagues and learning about our League. A major focus is developing a calendar so we can determine when key events might take place over the coming year. Events such as Democracy Works, State of the Community and Member Mixers or voter education/registration opportunities, such as high school registration opportunities, the Y.E.S. event, and possible candidate forums. You'll be hearing more as the year progresses!

MEET YOUR BOARD

We are very pleased to have several new League members and are always grateful for our longer-term members. Below is information about our current board members. Please note that we are still very much in need of someone to serve as the Voter Services Director. Ideally, two individuals would serve as codirectors to coordinate voter registration and voter education. We would provide lots of training and support, of course. Also, we need someone to manage our website.

Karen Urbano (President): I joined the League of Women Voters of Woodland over ten years ago and first became involved in the water study, as environmental issues were highest on my radar then. I was so impressed with this group of women that I stayed, becoming ever more aware of the importance of keeping our fingers on the pulse of government as well as encouraging others to do the same. What is the best way to do this? By being sure to vote in every election – local, state or national – and encouraging others to do the same. Our democracy depends on it.



Judy Wohlfrom (Vice President): It is hard to realize how the political atmosphere has changed so dramatically since the time I first was eligible to vote. Since joining the Woodland League about 4 years ago, I am thankful the critical work the League (nationally, statewide and locally) has done over that period. time, I enjoy gardening, walking my dog, practicing Tai Chi and Pilates, visiting family in Arizona, LA, and the Bay Area, reading, and cooking. I am excited to be on the board and look forward to contributing to our community.

2024 is just around the corner with the primary election on March 5 and the general election on November 5. MENTAL HEALTH STUDY UPDATE By Janet Ruggiero




The Mental Health Study Group will begin meeting once a month to continue doing the work needed to gather additional information on the

services being provided by other nonprofit agencies providing mental health services as well as other boards and commissions in the County delegated to provide oversight for mental health services. This information will assist the League in focusing on different areas to develop our position statement.

The first meeting will be virtual (via Zoom) and held on August 30 at 12:00 noon. Thereafter the meetings will be held on the fourth Wednesday of the month [9/25, 10/25, 11/29 (due to Thanksgiving)] at 12:00 noon in-person or virtually depending on the consensus of the study group.

As information is gathered and reported to the study group, we will use the data to focus on key issues we believe we can further study to develop possible positions for the League to consider. The plan is also to hold a meeting in January (the date yet to be determined) for all League members to become informed of what the study group has learned.

COUNTY-WIDE LEAGUE UPDATE By Lorna Carriveau

We are starting to lay the groundwork for developing a League of Women Voters of Yolo County. We're grateful to have the support of Local League Coaches Marie Baldiserri and Jacqui Canfield to help us understand the process and options should it be approved to form a

county-wide League. Not only would such a change affect our current Woodland and Davis Area Leagues, but also involve working with the California League, Secretary of State, IRS, Franchise Tax Board, and other entities to ensure all ducks are in order.

An important first step is reaching out to our and Davis Area League members for their interest in forming a committee. We are also contacting individuals in West Sacramento, Winters, the Capay Valley area, and other small towns and rural areas throughout Yolo County to solicit their interest and help.

Finally, we are developing a survey of members of the Woodland and Davis Area Leagues for feedback about the pro's and con's of the project so we can do our best to meet all current and potential members' needs.

If you would like to learn more or join the committee, please contact Lorna Carriveau at **carriveaul@att.net**. One of the first tasks of the committee will be to hold a virtual meeting with Marie Baldiserri and Jacqui Canfield. We anticipate this process taking two years overall given its complexity.

OUR LEAGUE HISTORY

"ANOTHER DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE" By Lorna Carriveau

In February 2020, we celebrated the 100 th anniversary of the passage of the 19 th amendment granting women the right to vote: another step toward American women's right to be independent.

Recently, I received a copy of *Winning the Vote: The Triumph of the American Woman Suffrage Movement* by Robert P.J. Cooney, Jr., from a member of the Davis Area League to share with our League. The book was published in 2005 and owned originally by Dorothy Brazelton, a long-time member of the League of Women Voters and Yolo County Women's History Month. The book is a detailed history of how women in the United States and elsewhere organized and persevered to become legitimate members of their democratic countries.

Reading through the 400+ page book quickly, I was struck by an image: a painting entitled "Another Declaration of Independence" by Paul Stahr published in a 1910 issue of Harper's Weekly which "borrows" from John

Trumbull's more famous earlier work, "The Declaration of Independence". The image reminded me of a group photo from our 2020 gala celebration of the speaker, Dr. Sally Rosch Wagner, and members of our League board who worked hard to make the event a success.

Our gala celebrating the 100th anniversary may not have been as elegant as the 1910 painting, but the spirit of democracy is as important now as it was over 100 years ago.

WOODLAND LEAGUE WEBSITE – MEMBERS' ONLY ACCESS

Below are instructions for league members to set up their "Members Only" site on our league website: **https://my.lwv.org/california/woodland**. NOTE: Before starting this process, if you have more than one email account, be sure that you use the one you gave the league when you became a member.

Use this link - https://my.lwv.org/user/password - to reach the page that allows you to request a password. You will enter your own email address in the box as directed. As directed, "answer" the robot, then click in the yellow box at

the bottom that says "e-mail new password".

You will be sent an email message from My League Online. So, go to your own email In Box and follow the link/instructions from the email message there which will include further instructions, including:

- Click on the link;
- Fill out your new password as prompted. Your password must be at least 10 characters long and should combine both lower- and upper-case letters and characters;
- Fill in as much information in your profile as you would like on the profile;
- "Answer" the robot;
- Click SAVE.

This process has now logged you onto the league website; another name for the website you may occasionally see or read is MyLO. Make sure that you remember/store your password to the website. You will now have access to the "Members Only" section of our website. Click on the Members Only name in the upper right-hand corner of our home page, and you will be able to access the league's Membership Roster, current Bylaws and other useful information.
