President's Message

April 20 - 26 is National Volunteer Week.

If anyone knows the power of volunteers, it is someone involved in the League of Women Voters. First as a local league president and now as state president, I have had a ring side seat to the hours of volunteer time that our members donate. Often people do not believe me when I say LWV Virginia is one hundred percent powered by volunteers. That is a testament to the dedication of members giving of their time to fight voter suppression, racist redistricting, and voter purges targeting naturalized citizens. And to everyone who spends hours in the heat and the rain registering voters, who lugs bags of materials to high school registrations, and organizes 411 and voter information sheets and candidate forums.

All of this is what keeps LWV thriving and meeting new challenges as we march into our 106th year of doing what we have always done – educate voters and defend Democracy.

And it is important to remember that activism comes in all forms. True confessions time, I have a pathological fear of being in the middle of large crowds with no way out. When I was a kid, and we had "assembly" which was when everyone gathered in the gym to hear something profound...I made darn sure I sat at the end of the row and had a clear sightline to that door. During the Women's March in 2017, I volunteered to host members from other out of state UU congregations, drive people to the Metro and then cook for everyone at the end of the day. (My hands still sweat when I recall the stories from people who said they were so packed in they were actually carried by the crowd.)

One way I now express my activism (in addition to my general work in the League) is by sending nonpartisan Get-Out-The-Vote texts through the "League in Action" app, making signs and supplying water for those who can face the great hordes without hysteria.

Don't denigrate your skills! There is no one size fits all method of activism. We all can do something. Don't let guilt stop you from expressing your gifts in diverse ways.

During this month's National Volunteers Week, please know how deeply your work is appreciated and how valuable it is, in whatever form it takes. When I sign off saying "thank you for all you do," please know it is not a platitude, it is a small symbol of my heartfelt appreciation.

We Need Stories of People Who Might be Harmed by the SAVE Act.

We need your help! As you know, the League is pushing back against the Safeguard American Voter Eligibility (SAVE) Act, which would

require citizenship documentation to register to vote even though voters in every state are already required to affirm or verify their citizenship status when registering. The *SAVE Act* would create one more barrier to the voting process, as many eligible voters do not have easy access to the necessary documents.

We are looking for stories of League members and others who could be impacted by the SAVE Act. Their stories can help us show how this law would harm voters.

We want to hear from any member (or voter) who is a US Citizen and fits the following criteria:

They lack easy access to documentary proof of citizenship (no valid passport or birth certificate) OR

Married/divorced women whose documents do not reflect correct current names

Trans individuals whose documents do not reflect their current names

Older people who don't have access to citizenship documents

Lower income people who do not have and can't pay for citizenship documents

People who may have lost documents in floods or fires

They have a physical limitation that will make it challenging to travel and present documentary proof of citizenship to their local election office in person.

Someone homebound or with a physical disability

Someone in a care facility or institution (including prison for states that allow voting)

Someone in a rural area very far away from an election office

Also anyone who is:

Not yet registered to vote OR

High school students

Young voters

New Americans

Likely to (or could) move in the future.

Renters

College Students

Retirees

Low Income voters

Federal Workers

Start Now to Fight 2025 Election Disinformation

The LWV VA Misinformation/Disinformation (Mis/Dis) Task Force encourages local Leagues to amplify positive messages from their election Registrars.

The 2024 election cycle highlighted the need for reliable election information to be available throughout the election cycle. In Virginia, the election cycle is underway once again. Making the public more aware of the systems in place to ensure election integrity is the best way to undermine false information.

Since the most reliable source of such information is each local election office, the Mis/Dis Information Task Force encourages local Leagues to actively share the information their local Registrars provide about how each election will be conducted, and what protections are in place to ensure the integrity of the voting process. Leagues and League members can share such information in various ways, including reposting election office information on social media. As part of this effort, Leagues are encouraged to consult with their city or country Registrar's Office on the challenges they face and the best ways to be of assistance.

Local Leagues are also encouraged to utilize the various League tools available to track and report mis/disinformation. These include VerbaAI, which works with LWV-VA to flag mis/disinformation.

The monthly LWVUS Democracy Integrity Briefings and bimonthly working group meetings are open to all League members. The briefings identify real-time mis/dis information around the country and how to respond. You can <u>register</u> for monthly briefings. This proactive tracking effort is in addition to other LWVUS resources found on the national website under the <u>Democracy Truth Project</u>.

Working closely with local Registrars and proactively fighting mis and dis information are not only important but build on the voter education work that Leagues already provide.
