

Vote Early

Early voting is easy!

- Registered voters may vote early at [their local registrar](#) any time between 45 days until election day and the Saturday before election day.
- Some localities offer [additional locations](#) for early voting.
- Once early voting starts, Vote411 publishes a nonpartisan guide and voting information at [Vote 411.org](#)

For the November 5, 2024 election, Early Voting Begins on September 20, 2024. Early voting sites are open weekdays and on Saturday, October 26, and Saturday, November 2, 2024. The last day for Early Voting is November 2. Specific early voting times can be found at [your local registrar](#)

- It's useful to have a list of who you want to vote for. You may have this list on your phone, but be careful not to use your phone in any way that disrupts the voting process or infringes on others' rights to secret ballots.

How do I use curbside voting during early voting?

Voters who are unable to enter the polling place for any reason of disability (not just physical) or who are 65 years or older may request curbside voting during early voting. On election day, there will be a clearly marked location for curbside voting.

If you personally believe your voting rights have been violated due to inability to access an early voting location
