#### Census 2020

Maybe you've seen the billboards along I-75. The census is coming beginning April 1st. The U.S. Census is required under the U.S. Constitution to occur every 10 years and is the process of counting every resident in the country. Participation in the census is mandatory; but for the first time ever, in 2020 the Census will be primarily digitally based. Read this <u>article</u> from the Detroit News that summarizes the information about the census.

Attorney General Nessel (pictured right) kicked off her statewide campaign for the 2020 census in Pontiac. Nessel said billions in federal funding will be lost if people don't fill out the census. Funding for police and fire departments, health care, education, and the roads is determined by the state's population. Nessel said the information collected will not be shared with law enforcement, that includes U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement. "I'm here as the top law



enforcement official in Michigan. People who are not citizens: this information will not be used against you," Nessel said

The U.S. Census Bureau is recruiting to fill hundreds of thousands of temporary positions across the country to assist with the 2020 Census count. If you are interested in being paid to count others, click <a href="here">here</a>. The League's Census work will occur in three phases: (1) Education; (2) Get Out to Count activities, (3) Watchdog reporting. In the months leading up to Census Day—April 1, 2020—Leagues around the country will be in communities sharing information and resources about how to participate and the importance of the U.S. Census.

ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) since it was first passed by Congress in 1972.On February 13, the U.S. House voted on H.J. Res. 79, legislation removing the ratification deadline on the ERA. This legislation is needed to remove the ambiguity around the deadline and bring it closer to taking effect. There is no deadline on equality, and now we must pressure the Senate to follow suit and help the ERA cross the finish line. Continue to use the ERA toolkit to elevate the importance of ratifying the ERA in the U.S. Constitution.

- Ten school district proposals:
  - Birmingham
  - Brandon
  - Clarkston
  - Farmington
  - Ferndale (2 proposals)
  - Pontiac (2 Proposals),
  - Southfield
  - Macomb Intermediate School District (which has part of its district in Addison Twp and Oakland Twp).

As Tina Barton, Rochester Hills City Clerk mentioned in the town hall (above), extra poll workers are needed for this election due to the expected number of absentee voter ballots that will need to be counted. Contact your local clerk to apply for jobs on election day.


#### **Book Club 2020**
