This summer the steering committee explored areas we want to focus on starting this fall. Since 2020 is an election and a U.S. Census year voter registration is more important that ever to assure that citizens have current registration and are aware of the importance of the upcoming 2020Census. Redistricting is an area we will definitely be exploring as well. This will happen in 2021 after the Census results are in. We are interested in attempts to put redistricting under a politically balanced committee to avoid partisan involvement that in the past has resulted in Gerrymandering.

We are looking into recycling and waste reduction issues in Norman, a world-wide concern, of course, that we can educate ourselves about and act locally.

Finally, the LWVOK will begin a study on Healthcare in Oklahoma. We do not have any position currently and use LWVUS positions. We would like to have an Oklahoma focused position statement to work from for advocacy on important health issues. An emphasis in this study will be mental health and maternal and infant care. Look for information in this Voter from Karen Cardenas, who is heading up the study. She is looking for contributions from Oklahoma League members. Send her an email with any ideas you have. If you can contribute time to the study let her know. Steering Committee member Judy Reynolds will be working on the study and keep us up to date on progress.

Areas of discussion will include the effect of this past Spring's legislative session, the impact of the Norman TIF and the decision to end that agreement, the impact of decreasing enrollment, and the current school year's anticipated budget needs.

Brenda R. Burkett, CPA, SFO, attended Oklahoma State University, graduating with a double major in Accounting/Agriculture Economics. She has been in education more than 26 years, working for Norman Public Schools since 1991. Brenda has been President of the Oklahoma Association of School Business Officials, is one of Oklahoma ASBO's Certified School Business Administrators, and was selected as the School Business Official of the Year in 2014-15. She also serves on the Advisory Board for the Oklahoma Center for School Business Management and is a frequent presenter at workshops and conferences held by both of these organizations.

National Voter Registration Day, Sept. 24, 2019




Here is a brief description of the menu options on our new site:
