Info from our Observers Corp:

Thanks to Kathleen Oleson and Ruth Bell for the updates below.

Little Rock Planning Commission: At the October 24 Planning Commission meeting LWVPC observer Ruth Bell spoke in opposition to an application to allow a parking lot to be approved for a complete block in downtown Little Rock. We opposed the parking lot because it was an inappropriate use in an Urban Use zoned area. Urban Use (UU) zoning is designed to facilitate pedestrian traffic, encourage retail business activity, and provide a livable urban environment. After considerable discussion about the parking demands of an

economically viable downtown, the Planning Commission approved the parking lot application by vote of 7 to 3. At the end of the Commission meeting it was announced that the Commission would meet informally on Nov. 7 to gather information on ways to provide for transportation needs of downtown businesses. Our observer commented about proposed changes to the Commission by-laws.

The Governance Committee: The committee appointed by members of Little Rock Board and the Mayor presented its recommendations to Mayor and Board at their Oct. 29 agenda meeting. Those recommendations are:

- **Minimum Electoral Requirement:** To be elected, candidates for city directors receive at least 40% of the vote in their respective elections.
- **Board Structure:** Regional districts should be established to replace at large positions.
- Board Size: A majority of the study group recommends Little Rock reduce the size of the board of directors from seven ward positions and three at large positions to six ward positions and two regional district positions. Should the board of directors choose not to change the size of the board, all members of the study group unanimously agree that three regional district positions should replace the three at large positions.
- Mayor's Authority to hire and remove City Manager and City Attorney
- The mayor shall have the authority to nominate, hire, or remove the city manager without precondition. After the mayor makes such nomination, hire or removal, the board of directors may override the mayor's action by a two-third's (2/3) vote of the number of members of the board of directors.
- The mayor shall have the authority to nominate or hire the city attorney subject to confirmation and approval of a majority of the board of directors. The mayor shall have the authority to remove the city attorney without precondition. After the mayor removes the city attorney, the city board may override the mayor's action by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the number of members of the board of directors. The mayor and vice mayor shall jointly conduct the annual review of the city attorney.
- **Citizen Education:** The City of Little Rock should create and implement a Citizen Education Program to equip and empower citizens to have equitable opportunities to participate in the political process.
- **Board Orientation:** Ensure that all newly-elected city officials receive a detailed preservice orientation to their specific role and responsibilities along with a thorough organizational overview.
- **Board Retreat:** The mayor and board of directors hold an annual retreat, which should include social, informational and planning discussions that are memorialized in writing and subsequently considered for policy decisions and related actions, budgeting, and timetables.

The City Board and Mayor thanked the governance committee for its work but took no further action on the recommendations at their Oct. 29 meeting.
