# ID Required to Vote in Person in Texas

One of the following accepted:

#### Photo ID

Not expired more than 4 years ago (Age 70+ may use expired ID)

- Texas driver license
- Texas Election Identification Certificate
- Texas personal identification card
- Texas handgun license by DPS
- U.S. military ID card with photo
- U.S. citizenship certificate with photo
- U.S. passport (book or card)

## <u>If no photo ID</u>, sign a simple form and present one of the following other documents:

- Voter registration card
- Certified birth certificate
- Current utility bill
- Bank statement
- Government check
- Paycheck
- Or any other government document with voter's name and an address

#### Note that

- Addresses on ID and voter registration need not match.
- Name on ID and voter registration must match or be substantially similar.
- Election officials/poll workers may not question you about voter ID

# ID Required to Vote in Person in Texas

One of the following accepted:

#### Photo ID
