



Voter Guide: May 2021 Ingram City Council Election

The League of Women Voters is a nonpartisan civic organization and does not support or oppose any candidate or candidates or political party. This voter guide presents candidate and election information on an election that has at least two or more candidates on the ballot for an office. All responses to questions come directly from the candidates and are not edited by LWV-Hill Country Texas.

Ingram City Council: term of office is two years.

The election is for three at large positions on the Ingram City Council. The three candidates with the highest number of votes will be declared as elected.

Ingram is a general law city (Type A) with a city council/manager form of government.

Duties: appoints the city manager; oversees the city manager and the direction of the city; approves the city budget and the tax rate; sets salaries and benefits of city employees; passes ordinances and resolutions; appoints members to advisory boards.

1. What in your background qualifies you to serve on the Ingram City Council?
