NOTES FROM THE NOVEMBER 9 GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING



Ruth Hemingson, Branch Manager of the Anoka County Library Northtown Branch manager, in Blaine, discussed the status of public libraries. She began her talk by describing how the Anoka County Library is responding several societal trends identified by the American Library Association's Center for the Future of Libraries. For example, under the Collective Impact category, the library works with senior centers and organizations concerned with homelessness, such as Stepping Stone Emergency Housing and transition homes. Libraries have always worked with Do It Yourselfers, such as home automotive mechanics. Along this line, Anoka County Library may in the future have a 3D printer for the public to use. With regard to Fast

Casual (as in dining trends), the Northtown branch has merged three different service desks into one. Libraries have always maintained confidentiality with regard to the public, referred to as an anonymity trend in social media where users can disguise or eliminate any identifier. The library has responded by deleting websites and searches on library computers people have used.

The library is about to undergo a large task of attaching RFID stickers (electronic tags) to every catalogued item. The stickers will provide efficiency to shelving and locating the library's resources. The work begins tentatively in December starting with the small Mississippi Branch, Fridley, to test the work procedures. The work will then proceed to other branches on a specific

UPDATE ON OUR POLLINATOR INITIATIVES

It's been a very productive and successful year for LWV ABC's community leadership on pollinator awareness.

The City of Anoka fall newsletter highlighted the summer activity of LWV members Zilla Way and Jean O'Donoghue to influence Anoka City council's decision to become a Bee Safe City:



Bee Safe City

At the request of the ABC League of Women Voters, the City's Parks & Recreation Board recently signed a resolution acknowledging Anoka as a "Bee Safe" City. While many factors play a role in becoming and maintaining a Bee Safe city, the overall purpose is to educate City staff and the public on the vital role that bees play in our everyday lives and what we can do to help sustain them. With the guidance and enthusiasm of Gretchen Sabel, many LWV ABC members teamed up with their local communities and residents to organize and promote *Bee Friendly* activities that will protect and restore pollinator habitat for all insect pollinators including bees and butterflies. Some of these activities included:

• Bee Safe City proclamations adopted by Andover and Champlin, along with the City of Anoka as referenced in the above text box.



- City of Andover held a very successful first annual Pollinator Garden Tour at six local sites.
 LWV ABC arranged publicity, LWV member Jeorgette Knoll provided one of the gardens, and other members hosted garden sites.
- Members staffed pollinator information tables at farmers markets in Champlin and Andover.
- Members organized and staffed a popular and interactive pollinator awareness table at the Green Expo sponsored by cities of Coon Rapids and Blaine
- Gretchen Sabel, with the help of Sandra Shanley, also organized and produced a very useful publication, *Pollinator Protection Resources*.
- Bee Friendly Champlin encouraged the Champlin Garden Club to offer native plants at their annual sale; all sold out. Bee Friendly T-shirts are now seen around town.
- The Champlin Garden Club planted a pollinator friendly demonstration garden at Doris Kemp Park on the Millpond and a Girl Scout troop cooperated with the Champlin Historical Society to plant a native garden at the historic Dunning School.
- The Champlin and Andover *Bee Friendly* teams sponsored floats in their community parades.
- Member Gretchen Sabel organized a panel of experts to address the topic of *Pesticides and Protection: Finding Balance* that was well attended by the community. She also organized a panel convened a panel of local experts who helped to launch our pollinator project, including Patricia Hauser of Humming for Bees, Joan Spence of the Anoka Conservation District and Mary Monte of the US Department of Agriculture.
