

WHY REGISTER TO VOTE NOW?

The last day to register to vote in the <u>2022 MA State Primary Election is August 27, 2022</u>, and the last day to register to vote in the MA General Election is Saturday, **October 29, 2022**.

All US congressional seats will be decided on **November 8, 2022**. Additionally, MA voters will elect state senators and representatives, Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of the Commonwealth and other state and county officials, and will vote on ballot questions.

To be eligible to register or preregister to vote, you must:

- Be a US Citizen
- Be 18 years old to register, 16 and 17 years old to preregister*
- Provide a valid driver's license number or the last four digits of SSN. If you have neither, you may still register to vote and will be asked for ID at the polls

VOTE BY MAIL BALLOTS

Vote by Mail applications will be mailed in July and September to every voter who hasn't already requested a mail-in ballot for the fall elections. These applications will be pre-addressed to your local election office and postage pre-paid. Vote by Mail applications can also be <u>downloaded from the Secretary of State website</u>. Completed ballots must be received at Town Hall by 8 PM on election day.

*registered voters must be 18 years of age on or before Election Day. Preregistered voters automatically become eligible to vote on their 18th birthdays.
