Contra Costa Fire Prevention: The Fire Prevention Bureau provides fire prevention services to citizens who live or work in the area.

Contra Costa County Fire Protection Districts: Contra Costa County Fire Protection District (Con Fire) provides fire and emergency medical services to nearly a million people across its 304-square-mile District area, and through mutual aid, in and around the 19 cities and unincorporated communities of Contra Costa County, California.
